

Key Dates:

July 24 - Delegates arrive

Answers to some common questions:

- Families can take short trips and include the delegate (no air travel without prior approval)
- An adult must be home with the youth during the day
- Delegates can attend school for a short period of time if host sibs go back before they leave but this must be approved by States' 4-H and natural family before arrival.
- Delegates will have medical insurance for their stay but families may have to cover expenses and can get reimbursed.
- Youth can attend camps. Need prior approval.
- Delegates cannot drive/ride ATV's
- Firearms and ammunition must be locked in a cabinet.
- To host the chaperone, you do not need to have children in the home.


