

TRIGGER TIME 4-H'ERS ATTEND AMBASSADOR TRAINING AT GRAVES MOUNTAIN


This past weekend, Trigger Time 4-H Club had three of their members and Ambassadors, Sam Seagle, Samantha Erick, and Lexi Strand, attend Ambassador Training at Graves Mountain Lodge, in Syria, VA. During the weekend, they practiced public speaking with speeches they had prepared before coming to training. They learned what a Shooting Education Ambassador represents and how to conduct themselves in a well manner. Team building games and activities were done and they had time for a beautiful hike for a break. They will have a second training in January.

WHAT IS A VIRGINIA 4-H SHOOTING EDUCATION AMBASSADOR?

The Virginia 4-H Shooting Education Ambassador Program offers teens the opportunity to demonstrate and build upon their skills in citizenship, leadership, and public speaking as they travel around Virginia serving as advocates and spokespersons for 4-H Shooting Education. The function of this group is to help build the shooting education program in Virginia, to help its members increase their knowledge of the sport and to meet like minded youth.

This is a service organization for which it is an honor to be chosen and is only as strong as its participants. General expectations of the Ambassador program include but are not limited to the following. Ambassadors must:

- be 14 years of age, but not over the age of 19 as of January 1, 2024 (may finish term past 19th birthday)
- have a GPA of 2.5 or higher
- be enrolled in 4-H and actively participating in a 4-H Shooting Education Program for at least 1 year (preferred)
- attend and actively engage in the events as designated on the Ambassador schedule. Note: Limited funds are available to offset much of the costs. However, Ambassadors may have to bear the cost of these trainings (meals, lodging, travel, etc.).
- serve a two-year term (renewable if selected)
- be willing and able to take limited time off from school (three to five days per school year)
- be aware that only a limited number of teens from across the state will be selected to serve as Ambassadors



Recruiting Host Families for the 2024 Japanese Summer Exchange

Virginia 4-H partners with States' 4-H to host young people from Japan for a month-long summertime exchange or homestay. We are recruiting host families across Virginia to host 18 young Japanese people and 2 chaperones for the summer of 2024.

Hosting Details and Requirements

- Program runs July 21-23 through August 16-18, 2024
- No previous 4-H experience is required
- Japanese delegates are ages 12-18 (most are 12-14)
- To host a delegate, a family must have a child who is 9+ years old.
- Families without youth can host adult chaperones.
- Families will be matched with a delegate of the same gender who is within 3 years of the host youth's age.
- All Host families will be screened and interviews as part of our risk management protocol.
- Host families receive no stipend to host a delegate.
- Japanese delegates have a range of English language abilities.
- Delegates are here to experience every day American life. No special activities need to be planned.
- Host Families will receive support from the state coordinator and other host families before, during & after the exchange (not financial)

Building Leaders for Advancing Science and Technology (BLAST) offers an exciting way for rising 9th and 10th grade students to spend three days of summer! Participating students get to stay in a college dorm and see what campus life is like on-site at one of our five partner universities: Old Dominion University, Radford University, the University of Virginia, Virginia Tech, or William & Mary. No previous experience in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) is needed, and this program is FREE for participants. BLAST is designed to help students find their place in STEM.


