

St. Patrick's Day, we're challenging our Prince William 4-H'ers to take this idea to the next level by transforming the shamrock to the 4-H Clover!

DIRECTIONS

- Find a 20" x 14.5" wood-framed chalk board. Hobby Lobby or other craft stores may have one. Rub it with food-safe beeswax to use for serving.
- 2. Start by making a shamrock for the middle of the board out of Havarti dill cheese or a similar type of cheese.
- 3. Take 3 slices and cut each one with a heartshaped cookie cutter. Then, press each heart into a plate of finely cut fresh dill to make it more green before placing them together in the middle of the board to form the shamrock shape.
- 4. Use one of the cheese scraps to form the "stem."
- Finish your cheese display by putting various meats, veggies, fruits, dips, spreads, etc. on your board.

The Virginia Department of Forestry, in cooperation with other natural resource conservation agencies and organizations, has proudly administered Camp Woods and Wildlife (formerly called Holiday Lake Forestry Camp) for more than 70 years. Camp Woods and Wildlife is an academic, structured, residential camp that focuses on field experiences in forestry and other natural resources. This unique camping experience introduces 13-16-year-olds to the challenges, special skills, and knowledge needed for managing the forest resources we use and enjoy every day.

Camp Woods and Wildlife is ideal for students who:

- wish to explore forestry and wildlife related careers
- * participate in forestry and wildlife judging teams, Envirothon competitions, or ecology clubs
- * want to experience hands-on learning and gain real-world skills in natural resources conservation

Camp Activities

- * Classes are taught mainly outdoors, by natural resource professionals.
- * Courses include: Sustainable Forest Management, Forest Ecology, Mapping, Environmental Protection, Forest Health, Wildlife Management, Tree Identification
- * Other learning experiences include urban forestry and forest products demonstrations; exploratory classes in topics such as forest fire equipment and tactics, wilderness survival, canoeing, and archery; and presentations by conservation police officers, wildlife researchers, and other natural resource professionals.
- * Campers participate in a Lumberjack Field Day with group competition in crosscut sawing, log rolling, and other traditional outdoor skills contests.
- * Recreation and athletics include swimming and volleyball.

Virginia 4-H STEM Summer Camps at Virginia Tech

Virginia Tech Fralin Life Sciences Institute on Virginia Tech's Blacksburg Campus, in collaboration with 4-H, is running six weeklong, half-day STEM Summer Camps. Camps will run Monday - Friday from 9 am - 12 pm, and are appropriate for kids ages 9-12. The camp is offered six times during the summer on the following dates (participants may only attend one week) and is limited to 16 campers per week.

May 28 - 31 June 3 - 7 July 8 - 12 July 15 - 19 July 29 - August 2 August 5 - 9





Registration is \$100 (May 28-31st which will be \$80) and is non-refundable. Click here to register.

Each day we will focus on different STEM topics including Geology (including jewelry making), Horticulture (tour of the Hahn Horticulture Garden) and Engineering (design build activities). Since a majority of our time will be in a lab setting the child must wear long pants (or skirt to the ankle, if appropriate) and close toed shoes. We will also be moving around campus so please make sure your shoes are comfortable and plan on being on your feet the entire time.

Snacks will not be provided however we will take a 15 min break around 10:30 am so that students can eat a quick snack outside and use the restroom. We encourage kids to bring a water bottle.

National 4-H Congress

For over 100 years, National 4-H Congress has served as the premiere educational and recognition event for senior 4-H members. It is held each year in Atlanta, Georgia, in late November or early December. National 4-H Congress offers participants an exciting opportunity to explore careers, engage in a variety of quality learning experiences, and have great fun by getting to know other 4-H members from across the country.

Outstanding 4-H members will be selected to represent Virginia at National 4-H Congress. Candidates for selection must be current-year senior 4-H members who are able to demonstrate outstanding achievement as a 4-H member in the areas of leadership, citizenship, and personal development.

APPLICATION PROCESS:

Virginia 4-H values the life skills that members develop through personal record keeping. The 4-H electronic portfolio, which replaced the 4-H Achievement Record, will serve as the foundation for a 4-H member's interview to participate in National 4-H Congress, if selected to move past the application stage.

The formal process includes two steps, which are intended to provide the 4-H member learning exercises that reflect an employment application and interview procedure:

- 1) The submission of a written personal resume and
- 2) Those selected for an interview will conduct a presentation of an electronic personal portfolio.

Personal Resume:

The personal resume is intended to give the 4-H member the opportunity to succinctly communicate his or her participation in the 4-H program, as well as to demonstrate service and involvement outside of 4-H. The 4-H member should utilize the portfolio as the source of the information for the resume and should creatively organize the resume to demonstrate outstanding achievement.

The resume, which should be accompanied by a candidate's letter stating why he or she wishes to represent Virginia at National 4-H Congress, must include (but need not be limited to) the following information:

- 1. Personal: Name, address, telephone number, and birthdate.
- II. Education: Chronological list of the schools attended and diplomas and honors/recognition received.
- III. 4-H Participation: List of club membership(s), projects, conferences, camps, and special activities (demonstrations, talks, judging events in which the member participated). Include dates of each project/ activity and, when appropriate, what was gained from participation.
- IV. 4-H Citizenship/Leadership: List significant leadership and citizenship/community service experiences carried out as a 4-H member. Activities that should be included are: offices held at the club, county, district, or state level; activities or events for which the member provided leadership; and any 4-H community service projects. Be sure to include dates, the role played, and what was accomplished.

- V. Leadership, Citizenship, Scholarship Outside 4-H: List, in chronological order, other significant citizenship or leadership experiences had outside of 4-H such as school, church, or other organization. Again, include date, the role played, and what was accomplished.
- VI. Letters of Reference: Attach three letters of reference from individuals who can attest to the member's personal attributes. One must be either a 4-H agent or a 4-H adult volunteer leader.

Interview Selection:

Finalists will be interviewed the week of State 4-H Congress. The interview process will afford the candidates the opportunity to gain additional presentation skills and orally communicate their 4-H experiences. Candidates will be encouraged to creatively utilize the resources they have included in their electronic 4-H portfolio to enhance their presentations. If selected for an interview, detailed portfolio directions will be provided to each finalist.

The interview teams will include: the State 4-H Program Leader and representatives from VAE4-HYDP, the State 4-H Cabinet, and the Virginia 4-H All Stars. Interviews will take place during Virginia 4-H State Congress.

Solar Eclipse 2024 from VPOST






