Next week in the final game in the league season, Trigger Time will compete against Missouri Military Academy.

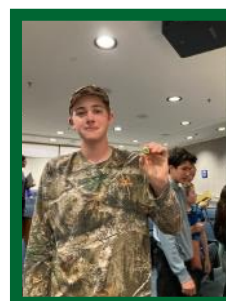
Prince William 4-H Youth Officer Training

Staff and experienced peers demonstrate how to set goals, plan, organize, budget resources, keep records, work in a team, problem solve, and so much more.

Here are some of the activities from the night:

- 4-H'ers Tim Hirshey and Noah Richter started the night off with a game of Boss vs Leader. They talked about what it means to be a boss as opposed to being a leader.
- 4-H'er Noah Richter demonstrated parliamentary procedures by holding a mock meeting using trail mix ingredients. The members made motions and discussed the different foods they wanted in their trail mix. The discussion was fun, and their trail mix ended up with marshmallows, pretzels, M & M's, and a small amount of raisins. Peanuts were voted to be added as wanted. Pinto beans and olives were discussed but were voted as no.

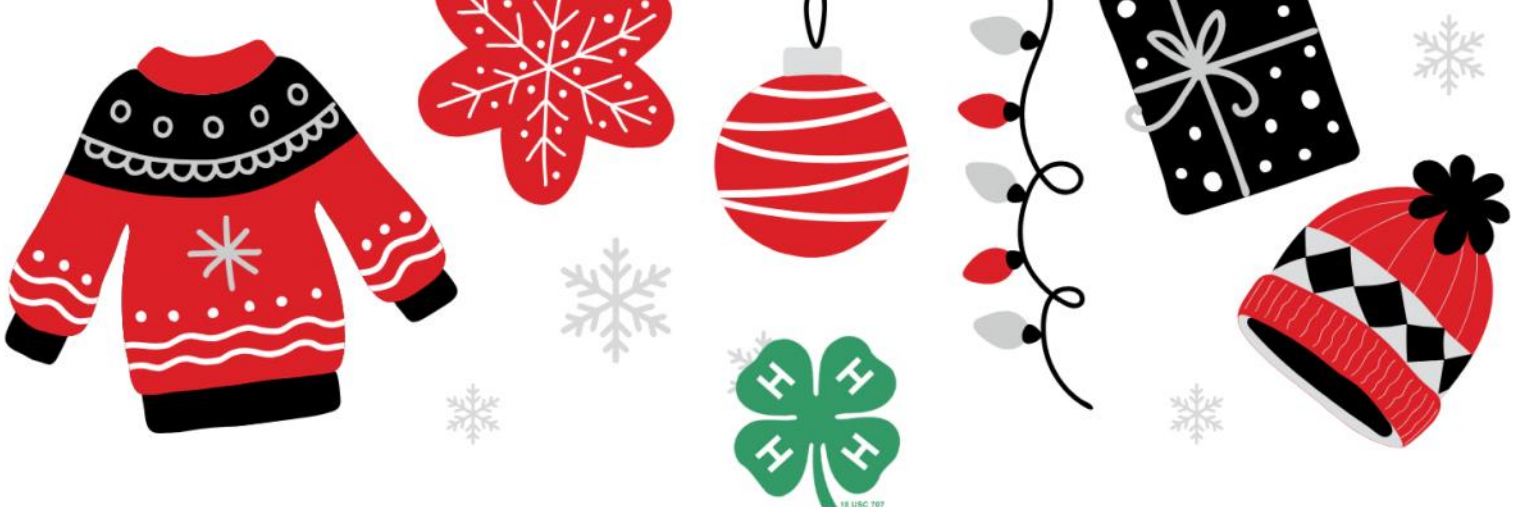

Embryology Project

“The Beginning of Life” 4-H Project is designed to help youth obtain a better understanding of life and embryonic development. 4-H educational materials guide students through each step of the hatching process from preparing the eggs for incubation to building a brooder for the newly hatched chicks. Educational materials address Virginia SOLs for math, science, English, life science, and computer technology. Prince William 4-H provides fertilized eggs, guides participants through training, supports participants during the hatch, and then collects the chicks to be sent to a local farm.

Prince William 4-H Clubs, Prince William County Schools, Manassas City Schools, Manassas Park Schools, and Homeschool Groups are invited to participate in this exciting 4-H project!

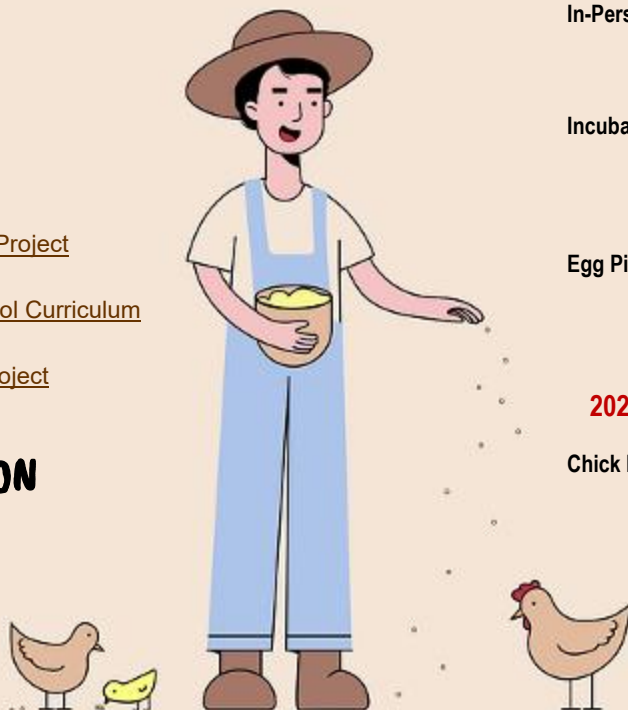

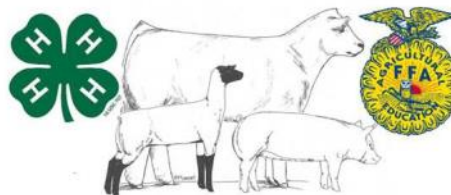
